
## RSPB Bempton Cliffs Reserve Guided Walks

Friday 9th and Saturday 10th Guided walks at 10.30am and 2pm

Visit the RSPB Bempton Cliffs Reserve and join the RSPB team on a guided tour of the reserve focussing on the historical interaction between humans and seabirds. Find out about 'climbing', egg collecting, and the Victorian exploitation, through to modern day management of the reserve.

The reserve is on the cliff road from the village of Bempton, which is on the B1229 road from Flamborough to Filey. In Bempton village, turn northwards at the White Horse public house and the reserve is at the end of the road after 1 mile (follow the brown tourist signs).

## The Baile Museum



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
### Ellerton Priory Church

The birthplace of Robert Aske one of the leaders of the 1536 Pilgrimage of Grace rebellion, All Saints Church has strong connections with the Aske family. Overlooking the vast expanses of the floodplains of the river Derwent the church can only be accessed on foot through a small gate and field adjacent to Aughton Hall. Search the tower for the carving of a newt known in Old English as an Ask. Open to the public with refreshments available throughout the afternoon.

Approximately 7 miles north-west of Howden and 9 miles south-west of Pocklington, west of the B1228 road and east of the River Derwent.

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
### Beverley Guildhall

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
### Skidby Windmill, Skidby, Cottingham
