



FREE heritage days out all year round!

At 7.6m the Rudston Monolith is the tallest standing stone in the UK. The Rood Stone is soon to be the focus of an exciting new interpretation project exploring the wider pre-historic landscape of Rudston.

The most intensively studied of Britain's 3,000 deserted medieval villages Wharram Percy occupies an attractive Wolds valley. Above the ruined church the outlines of lost houses are traceable on a grassy plateau. Explore with the aid of full onsite interpretation.

Hidden behind its 18th Century brick shell Burton Agnes Manor House is one of the most accessible medieval domestic buildings in Yorkshire with a well preserved Norman undercroft and 15th century roof. Open from 1st April - 4th November 11am until 5pm 7 days a week and on bank holidays.

Skipsea's Norman Motte and Bailey Castle dates from before 1086 and is among the first constructed in Yorkshire. The site includes the impressive earthwork remains of the fortified borough and inland harbor. Climb to the top of the bailey for some impressive views.

These are just some of the free heritage days out in the area.



Beverley Area

Meet the miller at Skidby Windmill, the farmer and artists a Cold Harbour Farm, sit in judgment at the Guildhall and go behind the scenes at the Treasure House.



Beverley Guildhall

Friday 7th, Saturday 8th and Sunday 9th September 10am - 10pm

(guided tours Friday 7th - 11am, 12pm & 1pm)
Outwardly a Georgian gem boasting 500 years of civic pride, the Guildhall's medieval roots are still visible. Marvel at the awe-inspiring courtroom, consider how it would have looked as a medieval great hall. Find the 15th century chains and count how many town beavers are lurking in the corners.

In the centre of Beverley near the main post office and County Hall.

Cold Harbour Farm and Art Studios, Bishop Burton

Sunday 9th September 11am - 4.30pm

Take a tour of the traditional and modern farm buildings at Cold Harbour Farm, lovingly converted into artist studios. Meet the artist, farming talks and demos old tractors and modern machinery throughout the day on this environmentally sustainable family farm.

From Beverley take A1079 to York. After the pond and the pub take the next left turn on leaving the village. Take the second road on the right and the farm is a mile up this road.

Skidby Windmill

Thursday 6th - Sunday 9th September 10am - 5pm (last admission 4.30pm)

Free entry to the last working English windmill north of the Humber and visit the Museum of East Riding Rural Life with displays illustrating the agricultural and rural history of the area. Simple child-friendly interactive exhibits and 'explorasacks' activity packs. Pop into the Sails Café for a refreshing copper, and visit the museum shop.

Skidby Windmill is 4 miles south of Beverley on the A164 Beverley to Humber Bridge.




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Underground Bunkers, RAF Holmpton, Withernsea

All Saints Church, Preston

When not on one of the guided tours why not visit Filey Museum just across the bridge from St Oswald's Church. Instantly recognisable by its whitewashed stone front, the observant eye will see a plaque dated 1696 with the words 'The fear of God be in you. The museum building itself dates from the 17th century and contains displays of local social history particularly Filey's connection to the sea.

Heritage Rail Trail Tour

Join the Yorkshire Coast Community Rail Partnership on an all day heritage rail tour of the Yorkshire Coast line.

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Jump on the train at Bridlington, Driffield, Beverley, Cottingham to meet up on the Hull Paragon Station at 10am to join the Heritage Rail Tour running from Hull to Scarborough. Stopping off at four locations on route, complete with tour guides and continual commentary, the tours include handouts and guide books with plenty of time to explore Beverley, Bridlington and Scarborough.



The Bayle Museum

Sunday 9th September 11am - 4pm

Museum of local social history, housed in the 12th Century monastic gatehouse of Bridlington Priory. Special activities for children include stone rubbing, interactive games, listening posts and life size figures. Access to the whole museum is via two staircases.

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Follow signs to Old Town, museum is next to the Priory Church. Buses from Bridlington bus station to the Old Town approximately every 20 minutes. On-street parking available.
