Project Summary

The CWWW LEADER programme has set out a priority objective of 'developing a strategic approach to the restoration and development of the (LEADER) area's inland waterways'. The aim of the inland waterways project is to bring together statutory, voluntary and community agencies to achieve shared goals through working in partnership.
